Dear RCS Family:

It has been a pleasure to have you and your student(s) as part of the RCS family this year, and we certainly hope that you will continue to allow us to come along-side of you again in the coming year to assist with the education of your student(s). As we prepare for the 2019-2020 school year, it is most helpful to know what each family's plans are for year. With that in mind, we ask that you prayerfully consider and complete the attached Notice of Desire to Continue Enrollment as soon as possible.

Families who wish to reserve a place for their student(s) for the coming school year should:

1. submit a Notice of Desire to Continue Enrollment stating the name of each current student who is to remain enrolled at RCS and at least 1/4 of each student's registration fee (\$65.00 for the first student and \$52.00 for each additional student) by February 10,
AND
2. submit at least 1/4 of the registration fee per month thereafter until the full amount of the published registration fee is paid in full
OR,
3. if intending to pay by AOSF scholarship, submit the Notice of Desire to Continue Enrollment with evidence or indication that a renewal application or a new application has been or will be submitted to AOSF.

Families should be aware that:

1. All registration fees not paid in full by May 31 will automatically increase by \$50.00.
2. Any student whose registration fee is not being paid at the required rate, or whose registration fee is not paid in full by May 31 is subject to having his or her enrollment at RCS terminated without refund of any fees paid.

To help you in your planning for next year, copies of *next year's*

1. tuition and fee amounts,
2. calendar,
3. dress code, and
4. handbook changes

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Notice of Desire to Continue Enrollment

It behooves the school and parent to be reminded periodically of the nature of their relationship. In order for a student's enrollment at Riverwood Classical School to continue into each succeeding school year, each of that student's parents or guardians must signify his or her desire to continue being assisted by Riverwood Classical School in the carrying out of his or her child's education by signing this form. When this form is returned, it must be accompanied by all or a required portion of the student's registration fee for the school year to which this notice applies. Only once this notice and the registration fee have been received will the student become officially enrolled for the next school year at RCS.

Application and Registration Fees: If application or registration fees are not paid in full when the application or re-enrollment is first submitted, a minimum payment of 1/4 of the fee, if first paid in February of the preceding year, or \$87.00, if first paid after February of the preceding year, per month is required until the fee is completely paid. Failure to make these monthly payments results in your student not having a reserved spot in his or her class until the payments are current.

Consumable Books and Supplies Fee: Each student will be charged for the cost of consumable supplies, workbooks, art and science supplies, etc. This charge is made in addition to each family's responsibility to provide the supplies listed on each year's supply list for each child in attendance. If payment in full is not made by August 10, then an installment fee must be paid and a minimum of 1/6 of the consumable fee must be paid each month from August through January until the fee is paid in full.

Testing Fee: Each family will be charged for each student in the family who is taking a standardized test. Only grades 2 through 12 will be tested, but all students tested will be charged. If payment in full is not made by August 10 then an installment fee must be paid and a minimum of 1/6 of the testing fee must be paid each month from August through January until the fee is paid in full.

Field Trip Fee: Each student will be charged a fee to cover the field trips planned for the school year. In the event that there are unplanned field trips which will exceed the amount of the fee collected, families will be charged for those as they arise. If payment in full is not made by August 10 then an installment fee must be paid and a minimum of 1/6 of the field trip fee must be paid each month from August through January until the fee is paid in full.

5.2 Dress Code

Although not intrinsically wrong, anything that would cause undue attention to be paid to a student or would cause distraction to other students is not allowed under the dress code. It is the intention of Riverwood Classical School to create an atmosphere that is conducive to focus and learning. Uniforms also serve as a small measure of the self-discipline intrinsic to the core Biblical values Riverwood seeks to uphold. We intend, by defining what is appropriate attire while in attendance at Riverwood Classical School or at designated school functions, to make complying with these principles simple and straightforward for parents and students. We do not intend to imply that other attire is not necessarily appropriate at other times. Therefore, the following dress code is provided:

Boys' School Clothing:

Pants: khaki or navy blue slacks or dress shorts, which may be worn with a black or brown leather belt

Shirts: dark (forest) green, red, light or navy blue polo shirts, turtlenecks, t-shirts, or button-down shirts, long or short-sleeved

Sweaters: navy blue, red, or dark (forest) green pull over or cardigan sweaters, vest or long-sleeved

Shoes: plain, dark shoes or plain, dark or light, tennis shoes or plain sandals

Socks: brown, black, white, or navy blue socks (socks need not be worn with sandals)

Girls' School Clothing:

Pants: khaki or navy blue slacks or dress shorts, which may be worn with a black or brown leather belt

Skirts/jumpers: khaki or navy blue skirts or jumpers

Blouses: dark (forest) green, red, or navy blue polo shirts, turtlenecks, t-shirts, or blouses, long or short-sleeved

Sweaters: navy blue, red, or dark (forest) green pull over or cardigan sweaters, vest or long-sleeved

Shoes: plain, dark shoes or plain, dark or light, tennis shoes or plain sandals

Socks: brown, black, white, or navy blue socks or tights (socks or tights need not be worn with sandals)

General Clarifications:

1. All skirts, jumpers, and shorts must not be shorter than the student's hand width (measured across the palm) above the knee. Shorts must be worn underneath all skirts and jumpers that are shorter than knee-length.
2. All pants, skirts, jumpers, shirts, blouses, sweaters, shoes, and socks must be solid colors; this means no stripes, flowers, decorative patches, logos, insignias, off-color collars, etc.
3. Tasteful hair accessories are appropriate but must not be used as self-expression. Hair accessories (clips, pins, etc.) should be in muted colors with no sequins. Hair ribbons must be navy, white, red or dark (forest) green. All fad-related hair accessories are prohibited. Hair must be styled in a manner that prevents the hair from covering the student's face or eyes, and any hair style that distracts a student from school is in violation of the dress code.
4. Any other accessories should also be muted in color, nondescript, not used as self-expression, and must match the school uniform being worn.

5. Denim is not part of the dress code.
6. Sandals must be solid brown, black, dark blue, or white with a strap to keep them on. No slip-ons, clogs, or flip flops. Crocs may be worn so long as they comply with the preceding.
7. Tennis shoes will be considered plain if their colors are primarily black, grey, navy, or white with no more than two accent colors.
8. Hats are not allowed under the dress code.
9. Overcoats, jackets, hats, ear warmers, scarves, and gloves are not covered in this dress code because they are not allowed to be worn inside the classroom. The only time that such clothing may be worn inside the school building is when the student is in the immediate process of coming inside from or going to the outdoors.
10. Any tattoos (temporary or permanent) on students must remain covered and out of sight to other students throughout the school day.

Clarifications for Grammar Students:

1. Boots, no matter what color, are not considered shoes for purposes of the dress code.
2. Dyed or bleached hair will not be allowed for boys or girls.
3. Girls may wear one pair of simple gold, silver, or pearl stud earrings. Each student may wear one plain watch. Other jewelry does not fall within the spirit of the dress code.
4. Nail polish and make-up is not allowed under the dress code. Students may use colorless lip balm for medicinal purposes.

Clarifications for Upper School Students (Transition Class and Above Only):

1. Girls may wear RCS school plaid (black watch) skirts, dresses, or jumpers in addition to the other school colors..
2. Girls and boys may wear black pants, but they may not be worn with black tops.
3. Girls and boys may wear white or black polo shirts, turtlenecks, t-shirts, or blouses, long or short-sleeved in addition to other school colors.
4. Boys may wear white, light blue, or school plaid (black watch) button-down dress shirts.
5. Boots may be worn in colors allowed for shoes in the dress code, unless they pose a safety hazard as determined by a student's teacher or the administrator. Multi-colored boots are not allowed.
6. Girls may wear one pair of small earrings on the lobe. Ear wear that could double for a fishing lure should be saved for other occasions. Earrings in double ear piercings, piercings around the top of the ear, or anywhere else are inappropriate. Earrings or other piercing-fillers of any kind are not allowed for boys.
7. Girls and boys may wear one watch. Girls may wear one small ring. Any other jewelry is not dress-code appropriate.
8. Hair color should be a color that God designed for human hair. Color used by girls should be subtle and not for the purposes of calling attention to themselves. Dyed or bleached hair is not allowed for boys.
9. Girls may wear one soft color nail polish (the same color on all nails). They may wear soft, subtle, natural colored makeup. Make up may not be applied during class time.

Deviation from the dress code, as determined by the school's administrator, will subject the student to discipline as described in Section 5 of this handbook.

Parents,

The following changes were approved by the board on January 24, 2019:

- 3.2 - Social Media Policy. RCS, through its employees, occasionally posts pictures of students to various forms of social media, including our website and Facebook, without identifying students by full name. Parents may opt out of this by signing the opt out clause found on page 2 of the Student Information Sheet.
- 4.2 - It is the general policy of RCS that students pass tests with a grade of at least 80%. Students making below 80% will usually be required to retake tests unless otherwise determined in the discretion of the teacher or administrator.
- 4.12 - Absent other circumstances which make testing necessary, standardized testing will generally be administered annually in the spring beginning in about 2nd grade.
- 5.2 - Dress Code, Upper School, Clarification 4 - upper school students may wear light blue button down shirts.
- 5.3 - Prohibited Items
 - Weapons: Students shall not be in possession of weapons on school grounds or at any school related events.
 - Toys: The possession of toys in the classroom is prohibited unless approved by individual classroom teacher. RCS cannot guarantee the safety of any items or toys brought to school.
